Carrier Worries Heighten:
Qwest May Be Subject Of Criminal Investigation
Federal Court Appoints Former SEC Chairman To Monitor
WorldCom

Washington, DC, July 5, 2002. In today's edition, the Wall Street Journal, citing unnamed sources, reported that the United States Department of Justice had launched a criminal investigation into Qwest. The exact subject matter of the investigation was not identified in the story. As you likely know, Qwest is already the subject of a Securities and Exchange Commission investigation. Responding to this report, Qwest said it had no reason to believe that the company is subject of any such investigation

In the ongoing WorldCom saga, a federal judge appointed former Securities and Exchange Commission Chairman Richard Breeden as corporate monitor of the civil fraud case against WorldCom. At a hearing Wednesday, District Judge, Jed S. Rakoff, named Breeden to oversee payments made to the company's board, executive officers and employees. Among other things, it is Breeden's responsibility to prevent unjustified payouts by WorldCom to these individuals as the SEC's fraud case gets under way. The judge set March 31 as a tentative starting date for the SEC's suit against WorldCom.
